Companion Homes: 24-Hour Support and Typical Home Setting

Companion homes offer 24-hour support and supervision for one adult in a home. Companion Homes follows the adult foster care model, which includes a room and board agreement between the provider and the individual. This allows for a long-lasting relationship to be established between the individual and the provider. The provider of the home will receive a daily rate based on the individual's needs, which are previously identified in the Person-Centered Service Plan. There will be a room and board agreement between the provider and the individual, which establishes an agreed amount that the client will pay every month to the provider.

Companion Homes are contracted with the DSHS' Developmental Disabilities Administration.



Is my loved one eligible to live in a companion home? They must be a DDA client and;

- 18 years or older
- Currently on or approved for Home and Community-Based Services Core Waiver
- Been assessed to need Companion Home residential habilitation services to meet their health and welfare needs in their Person-Centered Service Plan
- Able to pay for room and board with their personal financial resources
