


Washington State Governor's Office of Education Ombuds

Ombuds (OEO) to reduce the
opportunity gap by supporting families,
students, educators, and communities
in understanding the public K-12
education system and resolving
concerns collaboratively. The
legislature placed us within the
Governor's Office to ensure our
independence from the public
education system.
